

HONOR ILLINOIS AUTHORS TODAY AT WORLD'S FAIR

Literature day will be observed today in the program of Illinois achievement week at the Illinois Host house at A Century of Progress. Illinois writers will be guests of the Fair at the Illinois building.

Mrs. F. Jefferson Redfield, chairman of the program, announced that representatives of three universities—Illinois, Northwestern, and Chicago—would be present at the afternoon program from 1 to 5 o'clock to point to the contributions to literature made by their institutions. Vincent Starratt, president of the Society of Midland Authors, will preside at the evening program, beginning at 8 o'clock.

Among those to speak in the evening will be Carl Sandburg, Mary Hastings Bradley, James Weber Linn, and Lew Sarett. Ethel M. Colson Brazelton will pay tribute to deceased Illinois authors. Mrs. James Henry Jackson of the Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs will speak on "A Century of Illinois Authors."

MARCONI AND HIS WIFE TO ARRIVE IN CITY SUNDAY

Guglielmo Marconi, inventor of wireless, will arrive in Chicago, with his wife, on Sunday, to attend the World's Fair and participate in the American Legion convention. He will deliver a formal address in behalf of the Italian government at the opening of the convention in Soldiers' field Monday morning at 10:30 o'clock.

"A Century of Progress would not be complete unless it paid homage to the man who has made the nations of the world neighbors," said Commander Luigi Ranieri, general director of the Italian pavillion at the Exposition, yesterday.

Upon their arrival the Marconis will be welcomed by a reception committee and escorted to the Drake hotel where they will stay. Later they will attend mass at the Holy Name cathedral, and a Sunday evening banquet in the Stevens hotel.

Senator Marconi will be officially received at the Fair Tuesday afternoon.
